WEEK 2 (OCTOBER 13th)
A PRAYER FOR INTERNATIONAL E-WASTE DAY

COP30 is the 30th annual Conference of the Parties to the United Nations climate change framework, starting this week in Belém, Brazil, right in the heart of the Amazon. Voices from the global south are calling for a decisive move from promises to practice, an end to the fossil fuel era and for the promised *Loss and Damage Fund*, for poorer nations most affected by climate change, to become operational. Pray that policy makers and world leaders will be moved and act to protect God's beautiful creation. Pray for faith groups to be well represented and their voice heard.

WEEK 3 (NOVEMBER 17th)
PARTNERS IN ACTION ANNUAL RETREAT

This week our Partners in Action meet for their annual retreat. Our partners are a mixture of Christian land managers and land owners, charities, bible colleges, retreat centres, and more. With our support, they are working to manage their land for nature by focusing on specific species and habitats from our Target 25 list of vulnerable species. Please pray the retreat is a time of learning and encouragement together as we seek to honour God by caring for his creation, and inspire and equip more land managers to do likewise.

WEEK 4 (NOVEMBER 24th)
